
Our Basic Methods:

- Start with current smoking rates, deaths
- Use **WHO** estimates for lives saved by 2060. This extrapolates current MPOWER strategies derived from the FCTC.
 - Uses conservative assumptions derived from a DELPHI process of experts
 - Calculate lives saved attributable to NGPs + NRTS + lung cancer management
 - Engage national experts to interpret results and finalize data
- Estimate the additional benefit on lives saved of:
 - Increased access to currently available new generation products
 - Increased access to NRTs and better diagnosis and treatment of lung cancer
